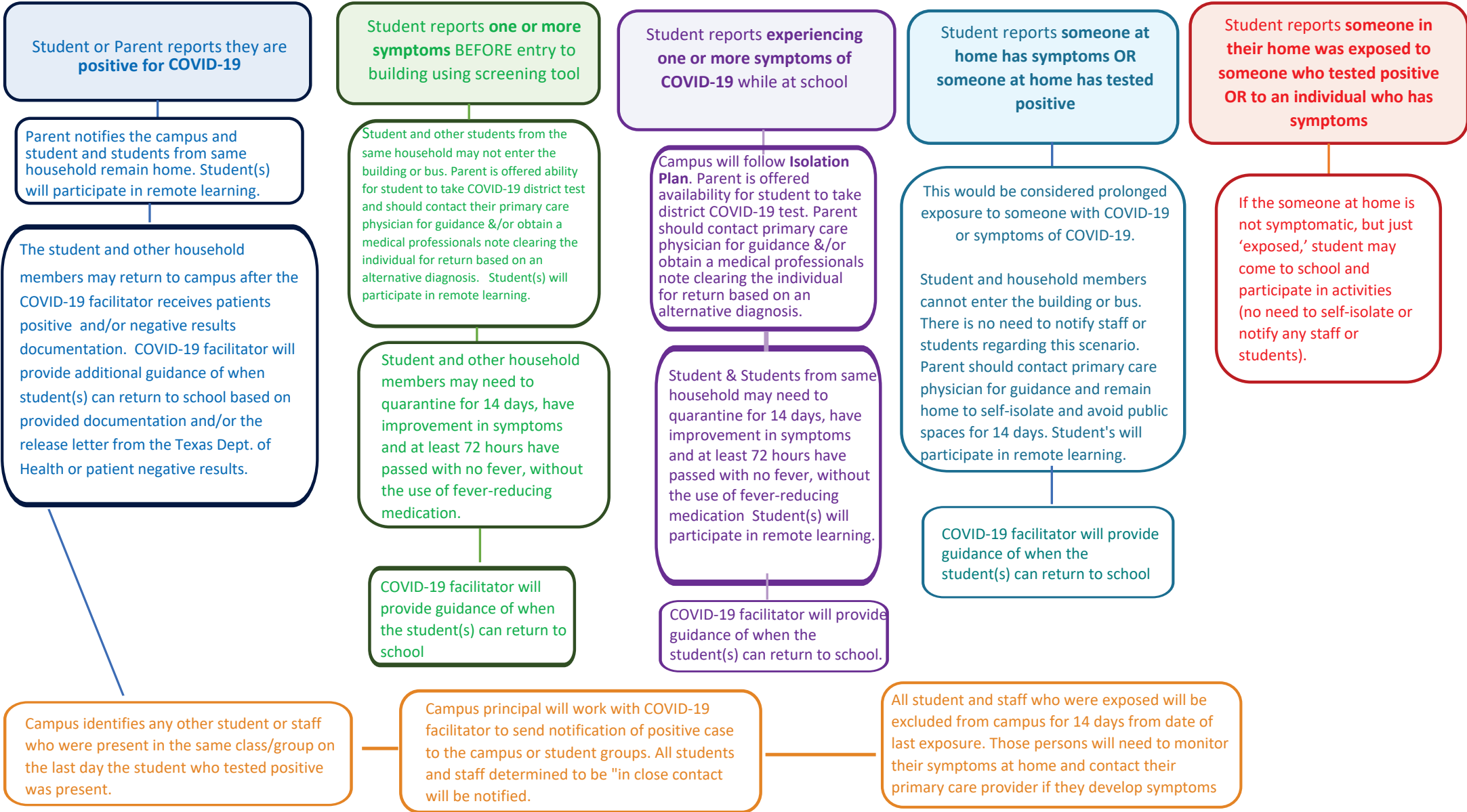


# FHISD Student Process Map for COVID-19

\*\*DISTRICT COVID-19 TESTS ARE ONLY AVAILABLE FOR STUDENTS ATTENDING FACE TO FACE INSTRUCTION & WHO ARE SHOWING SYMPTOMS



Student or Parent reports they are **positive for COVID-19**

Parent notifies the campus and student and students from same household remain home. Student(s) will participate in remote learning.

The student and other household members may return to campus after the COVID-19 facilitator receives patients positive and/or negative results documentation. COVID-19 facilitator will provide additional guidance of when student(s) can return to school based on provided documentation and/or the release letter from the Texas Dept. of Health or patient negative results.

Campus identifies any other student or staff who were present in the same class/group on the last day the student who tested positive was present.

Student reports **one or more symptoms** BEFORE entry to building using screening tool

Student and other students from the same household may not enter the building or bus. Parent is offered ability for student to take COVID-19 district test and should contact their primary care physician for guidance &/or obtain a medical professionals note clearing the individual for return based on an alternative diagnosis. Student(s) will participate in remote learning.

Student and other household members may need to quarantine for 14 days, have improvement in symptoms and at least 72 hours have passed with no fever, without the use of fever-reducing medication.

COVID-19 facilitator will provide guidance of when the student(s) can return to school

Campus principal will work with COVID-19 facilitator to send notification of positive case to the campus or student groups. All students and staff determined to be "in close contact" will be notified.

Student reports **experiencing one or more symptoms of COVID-19** while at school

Campus will follow **Isolation Plan**. Parent is offered availability for student to take district COVID-19 test. Parent should contact primary care physician for guidance &/or obtain a medical professionals note clearing the individual for return based on an alternative diagnosis.

Student & Students from same household may need to quarantine for 14 days, have improvement in symptoms and at least 72 hours have passed with no fever, without the use of fever-reducing medication Student(s) will participate in remote learning.

COVID-19 facilitator will provide guidance of when the student(s) can return to school.

Student reports **someone at home has symptoms OR someone at home has tested positive**

This would be considered prolonged exposure to someone with COVID-19 or symptoms of COVID-19.

Student and household members cannot enter the building or bus. There is no need to notify staff or students regarding this scenario. Parent should contact primary care physician for guidance and remain home to self-isolate and avoid public spaces for 14 days. Student's will participate in remote learning.

COVID-19 facilitator will provide guidance of when the student(s) can return to school

Student reports **someone in their home was exposed to someone who tested positive OR to an individual who has symptoms**

If the someone at home is not symptomatic, but just 'exposed,' student may come to school and participate in activities (no need to self-isolate or notify any staff or students).

All student and staff who were exposed will be excluded from campus for 14 days from date of last exposure. Those persons will need to monitor their symptoms at home and contact their primary care provider if they develop symptoms
